**Kelly Campbell** is the Pathways to Settlement Manager for the Migration Programme here in Ōtepoti Dunedin. She started working at NZ Red Cross as the Settlement Social Worker from January 2017 to October 2019 supporting the former refugee community. Kelly is a Registered Social worker.

Prior to working at the Red Cross, Kelly worked in family violence in Te Whanganui-a-tara (Wellington) working mainly with Wāhine Māori. She is Māori and whakapapas to Te Arawa, and her tipuna originate from the Bay of Plenty.

Kelly's interests are community development, indigenous knowledge, cultural diversity, and activism.

**Alaa Sukkar** works as Settlement Lead at New Zealand Red Cross. He arrived in New Zealand through the refugee quota in late 2017 and settled in Dunedin. Alaa is originally from Damascus, Syria, and completed a Bachelor of Business, specialising in political and economic crisis management whilst in Syria.

Since arriving in New Zealand, Alaa decided to pursue a career in social services and was employed with New Zealand Red Cross as a Settlement Case Worker in 2019. His role with Red Cross in Dunedin is to support former refugees to settle into their new home and assist with providing public education and raising awareness with local mainstream service providers on refugee journeys and best practice work with former refugees.
